



AmazonSmile is a way for customers to support their favorite charitable organization every time they shop with Amazon.

Shoppers who start at smile.amazon.com will find the same Amazon they know and love, with the added bonus that Amazon will donate a portion of the price of eligible purchases to the charity of your choice. Signing up is easy!

How to register via computer:

1. Go to smile.amazon.com.
2. Sign in with your email address and your Amazon password, or if you are new to Amazon, please create an account.
3. On your first visit to AmazonSmile, you will be prompted to select a charitable organization; go to “Or pick your own charitable organization.”
4. Search “Regina Health Center” and select the “Richfield, OH” location option.
5. If you already have an existing account with a charity selected and would like to change your charity selection to Regina Health Center, go to “Your Account” from the navigation at the top of the page and then select the option to “Change Your Charity.”

Please note that Regina Health Center will only receive a percentage of your order if you shop from smile.amazon.com, not through the standard website.

How to register via Amazon app for Phone or Tablet:

1. Log in to your Amazon Shopping App
2. Go to the three bars on the right corner, scroll and select “Settings”
3. Select “Amazon Smile” then “TURN ON” under “Mobile App” and enter “Regina Health Center”
4. Tap the downward arrow next to “Mobile App: ON” to see when your next renewal date is. Be sure to go back in to your settings and set up Amazon Smiles at the renewal date. It will need renewal twice a year, there is no extra cost to you.
5. Shop! You can now shop as normal and Amazon Smiles will be donating 0.5% to Regina Health Center with each qualified purchase you make.

Please note that Regina Health Center will only receive a percentage of your order if you remember to renew your Amazon Smiles mobile account twice a year.
