KATIE AND BUD KOCH DONATE NEARLY \$500,000 TO ENDOWMENT FUND



Care delivered from the heart. It's what long-time Regina Health Center (RHC) Board Member Katie Koch and her husband, Bud, have witnessed time and time again in their more than 25 years as RHC benefactors. A strong belief in the mission led them to being ardent supporters of the Holy-In-One Golf Outing, past building renovations and the annual fund. In Fall 2025, this affinity, along with wanting to contribute to the longevity of the ministry, inspired Katie

and Bud to gift nearly \$500,000 to the RHC endowment fund.

This is the second major contribution the Kochs have made to the endowment fund; the first, in 2018, was for \$200,000. They are the largest individual donors to the endowment fund to date, as well as the largest individual donors in RHC history (excluding estates or organizations).

"The endowment ensures the future of Regina Health Center," said Bud. "It makes RHC a more viable ministry and is a stable piece of the budget that will be there every year."

A Commitment to Happiness Recognized

The Kochs became familiar with RHC when they lived in Richfield's Glencairn neighborhood. From the first time they attended Mass in the Holy Family Chapel, they knew RHC was unique.

"It's peaceful here. You can see the nurses and staff love what they do. They are committed to the residents' comfort and happiness," said Katie. "It's heartwarming to see their

A LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

THE CORE OF REGINA HEALTH CENTER: A FAITH-CENTERED ENVIRONMENT YESTERDAY, TODAY AND ALWAYS



Last month, Regina Health Center (RHC) held its annual Jubilee Tea. Thirteen of RHC's retired Religious and Ordained residents who are celebrating 50, 60, 70 and 75 years of being consecrated women and men of the Church were recognized (you can learn about each one on page 6).

It's evident at the Jubilee Tea, but also in life enrichment activities (learn more on page 9); at our fundraising events, such as the Holy-In-One Golf Outing (page 7); and most especially in our everyday care of residents, something Bud and Katie Koch witnessed as both a resident family and as donors (page 1).

Our work is centered around respecting, supporting and valuing each resident, and that will never change. With our faith ever guiding us, we will keep the dignity of each person at the heart of our mission.

Bud added, “The grounds at RHC are beautiful; it’s a good environment to visit your loved one.”

Knowing this led the Koch family to becoming not only committed donors, but also resident family members. Bud’s mother, the late Elizabeth Koch, lived at RHC for several years before she passed in 2023. The Catholic environment and a good nursing reputation, plus their familiarity with staff, made the decision to move Elizabeth to RHC an easy one to make.

“When my mother needed skilled nursing, it would have been a tough decision to send her elsewhere,” said Bud. “We were lucky to have her move to Regina Health Center. It was very reassuring to know she was receiving the best care possible.”

Maintaining Future Excellence

Continuing the legacy of high-quality care, just like his mother received during her time as a resident, played an integral role in Katie and Bud giving to the endowment.

“Seeing how my mother was attended to is really why we have stepped up contributions over the years; we want to keep that going,” said Bud.

The demand for senior living homes and skilled nursing, he noted, is always going to be there.

“A healthy endowment lets you provide services now, and makes sure you can do it down the road, too. It gives you more flexibility as an institution. This is a top-notch facility. Those standards need to remain in place.” — Bud Koch

Regina Health Center Board of Directors President John Mulligan is grateful for the Kochs and the many ways they have advanced the RHC mission over the years. He, too, realizes the value of the endowment gift and wants RHC to be in the best position possible today, tomorrow and beyond.

“For many years, Katie and Bud have regularly provided an extraordinary level of support to RHC. They’ve volunteered, served on committees and the board, and given critical financial contributions,” said John. “Their major endowment gift this past year will afford RHC with important ongoing revenue to enable the ministry to continue to offer high quality programs and facilities to residents for years to come.”

Care delivered from the heart. It’s what inspired Katie and Bud Koch to initially give to Regina Health Center. Now, it’s their own caring hearts that make a difference and inspire others to do the same. ♦

STAFF SPOTLIGHT ::

Life Enrichment Activities Assistants are the “Have-Fun” Crew

Life enrichment — formerly known as activities — is a constant presence at Regina Health Center (RHC). At least one member of the team is at RHC 365 days a year, with holiday, weekend and evening programming available.

The team creates three different life enrichment calendars every month, each one tailored to best fit skilled nursing, special care unit and assisted living residents, respectively.

The life enrichment team includes a certified activities director, as well as three full-time assistants: Morgan Tegarty, Eric Miller and Sam Rees. All three recently shared their thoughts on how they spend their days at RHC, what activities they have introduced and why life enrichment is so important.

When you prepare for your day at RHC, what can you expect?

Morgan: Every day starts by delivering *The Daily Chronicle* and word search. It gives us the chance to tell residents about the day's activities and see if they need help being transported to attend. We then take the lead on facilitating both the 9:30 a.m. and 2 p.m. activities.

In between, we likely are working on bulletin boards, setting up for the next activity, helping residents get to/from their rooms or having one-on-one chats. Getting to know residents on a more personal level and having genuine conversations with them is important.

What activities have you proposed during your time here?

Sam: I have a bachelor's degree in fine arts. On one of my weekend shifts, I planned an art appreciation talk about different artists, including Pablo Picasso. The next day, we made Picasso portraits. Planning events like this lets me feel like I am hanging out with a bunch of wonderful grandparents.

What is your favorite part of being an activities assistant?

Eric: Seeing the smiles on residents' faces during what otherwise may be a tough time in their lives. We once had a short-term resident who only came to a few activities because she was constantly working on

physical therapy. After being discharged she sent us a thank you card referring to us as “the have-fun people.” That has really stuck with me.

Why do you feel the life enrichment department is so important at RHC?

Morgan: RHC has a holistic approach to the care provided. The mind and spirit are just as important as the body. Life enrichment gives attention to all three.

Eric: We show residents that they can do the things they love, and that they can still try new things regardless of their age or any disabilities. ♦

Leaving Your Legacy: EXPLORE PLANNED GIVING FOR REGINA HEALTH CENTER

Every legacy begins with a story. Katie and Bud Koch's decision to make an endowment gift — their legacy at Regina Health Center (RHC) — was a result of their experiences as both a resident family and as donors. Current and future residents will benefit from the Kochs' generosity, all because their story led them to witnessing and being inspired by the compassionate care provided at RHC.

Your RHC story can also be written in a way that leaves a lasting impact and will touch the lives of residents well into the future. Although this can be through an endowment gift, it can also be through a **planned gift**.

A planned gift allows your philanthropic vision to come to fruition while also deciding how you want to be

remembered. Some of the best ways you can support RHC today and create a legacy for tomorrow include:

- **Beneficiary Designation:** Direct holdings in retirement savings and bank accounts such as 401(k)s, IRAs and CDs to be transferred or paid to RHC without going through probate.
- **Life Insurance:** Make RHC the beneficiary or even the owner if your family no longer needs your life insurance policy.
- **Will or Trust:** Include RHC in your will or trust, designating a specific dollar amount or percentage. If your estate is particularly complex, gift instruments such as Charitable Lead Trusts (CLT) and Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) may be worth considering.

RHC has partnered with **FreeWill**, an easy-to-use online estate planning tool, to help you share your story through your plans.

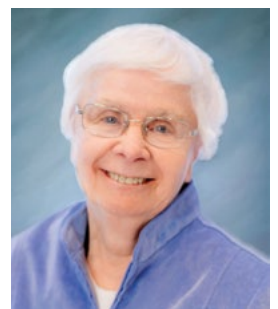

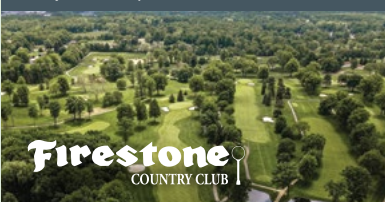

The CMS rating system assesses three key areas, including health inspections, quality measures and staffing levels.
